

For many, pantomime is the spark that lights a lifelong love of theatre. As a theatre rooted in the local community, we understand that not every child has the opportunity to go to a pantomime, so we've made it part of our mission to take pantomime to as many children as we can.

Every year our Intro to Panto roadshow visits schools throughout Wolverhampton, the Black Country and beyond, bringing the magic of live theatre to your school hall. To date we have performed to over 30,000 children. For many it's their first experience of live theatre, but the memory lasts forever.

Our Intro to Panto roadshow is split into two halves, the first 30 minutes is an interactive workshop led by our three performers and the Grand Theatre's resident Panto Dame, lan Adams.

We explore the history, jokes, routines and songs of pantomime – this is more

suitable for years 4, 5 & 6.

There is then a 20 minute break followed by a 40 minute production of the forthcoming Grand Theatre pantomime, which is suitable for the whole school.

The workshop and performance are fitted around a morning or afternoon break-time.

NTRO TO

We're committed to reaching as many children as possible, so have priced the Intro to Panto roadshow as competitively as possible. Each performance is priced at £300+VAT. Schools who book two performances on the same day will pay £550+VAT (Please note, schools can claim VAT back).

Our performers are all DBS checked, and accompanied by a member of Grand Theatre staff at all performances.

Places do sell quickly due to the tour's popularity, so we always advise you to book early to avoid disappointment.

Bringing the community together through the magic of pantomime.





For 2022/23's Pantomime Project, the Grand Theatre once again collaborated with Heath House Studios. We decided to base the project on the theme of 'Wishes, Lamps, Trinkets and Treasures', as they feature heavily in the pantomime, Aladdin.

The project began back in September 2022, when Pauline from Heath House Studios visited 31 local community groups to deliver a free two hour textile workshop. During these workshops participants stitched, created and crafted a variety of trinkets and treasures that you can see in the photo above.

The exhibit, 'Aladdin's Grand Antique Shop', featured around 500 pieces of work, each one created by the participants involved. Aladdin's shop is where the heroic boy himself stores the incredible treasures he has found during his visits to many different countries. The project also mirrors this, as people from countries such as Bangladesh, Yemen, Afghanistan, China and Ukraine were involved.

As a partner of the National Theatre, The National Theatre Collection is free for UK State Secondary Schools and **Further Education Colleges to stream**


The National Theatre Collection not only gives you free access to 50 high quality filmed National Theatre productions, but you will also be able to access resources such as rehearsal notes and short films

Tell us about your role here at the Grand Theatre?

I'm the Associate Director of Technical Services, I look after all technical aspects of Productions. I liaise with Production Managers to make sure everything runs smoothly when they arrive here at the Grand. This can include the fit up (building of the set on-site) to staffing the show and then of course packing it all away again.

Tell us about the different kind of roles a member of the backstage team might undertake during a typical show week?

There are many varied roles backstage, from being a dresser for the cast, working a follow spot, crew on-stage assisting with scene changes, flyman flying scenic pieces, lighting operator or sound operator. These are just some off the roles you can work during any production.

Is there a typical route that technicians take into working backstage?

Not as such, there are technical courses now in stage and production management you can attend at university. Another great route to get into theatre is to join an amateur dramatic society as you can help with their productions backstage, I've had few of our crew come through this route.

What advice would you give someone who would like to be a backstage technician?

Email your theatre asking if they need any crew for ins and outs as you can start at the entry level and find what discipline suits you, Stage, LX (lighting) Sound, AV or as mentioned above, join an amateur society.

Are there any opportunities for young people to experience the Grand Theatre's technical department?

You must be 18 to work here at the Grand, but we are looking into starting backstage academy next year where young people can learn more about all the technical aspects of shows.

What's your favourite part of your job?

For me it's seeing a production you've worked and planned for months, finally at the Grand, built, and open on the first night.

If you could spend a week in a different department here at the Grand, which one would it be and why?


I'd like to work in Front Of House department, we always work closely together, but it would be great to see what happens from an audience perspective.

What's your favourite production and why?

The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time, I loved the way the set went together, really interesting build using grid references to lay the floor, and also big fan of the show and book.



& CAREER TALKS



Members of the Outreach Team are more than happy to visit schools and colleges to deliver talks about all of the jobs and careers available in theatre. Something that surprises many students who often imagine that the only jobs available in theatre are as a performer. SPEAK UP SCHOOLS PROGRAMME YEAR 1 SUCCESS

Speak Up is the National Theatre's nationwide programme which sees young people, who have been most affected by the pandemic, working in collaboration with local artists and teachers to co-create artistic responses to issues that are most important to them. Responding to the current challenges in schools, the programme aims to develop young people's self-expression, wellbeing, and personal skills, with an open-ended offer to make creative projects in their local area. It is in partnership with **Wolverhampton Grand Theatre as** part of the national programme, which is also being delivered in **Doncaster, Greater Manchester** (Rochdale, Salford, Wigan), Leicester, North Devon, Outer East London and South Essex, Stoke-On-Trent, Sunderland, and Wakefield.

peak Up aims to inspire a movement of young people who want to speak up about the issues that matter to them – in their schools, their communities and nationally. Young people will work collaboratively with their teachers, artists, local arts organisations, and the National Theatre to make artworks and creative projects.

Speak Up forms part of TNP (Theatre Nation Partnerships) and partners include – Cast in Doncaster.

The Lowry in Salford, Queen's Theatre Hornchurch, Leicester Curve, Landmark Theatres venues in North Devon, Regent Theatre and Victoria Hall in Stoke-on Trent, Sunderland Empire and Sunderland Culture, Theatre Royal Wakefield, and Wolverhampton Grand Theatre.

Wolverhampton Grand Theatre's partner Speak Up Schools include Ormiston New Academy, Colton Hills Community School, Tettenhall Wood School and Aldersley High School Horizon Hub, Charlton School, and Ormiston Shelfield Community Academy.

Young people have worked with several artists and practitioners from across the Midlands and have taken part in mixed medias, fine art, graffiti art, photography, filmmaking, Brazilian drumming, and steel pan.

Ormiston New Academy have worked with their Speak Up representative Tristan Jones-Smith to produce a film about academic pressures with the support and assistance of local film-makers Wolf Collective. Colton Hills Community School also worked with Tristan and produced a film about living with neurodiversity with the support and assistance of local film-maker Enzo lantosca.

Ormiston Shelfield Community Academy worked with their Speak Up representative Fran Richards

and local film-maker Kieran Vivas to produce a short film highlighting the issue of knife-crime in Walsall. entitled 'How to Waste a Life'. The film premiered at the Wolverhampton Grand Theatre in July. The young people enjoyed an Oscars style evening with red carpet, awards, and speeches. The film is dedicated to the memory of a former Shelfield pupil Reagan Asbury, who sadly lost his life to knife-crime whilst on a night out in Walsall. Most notably. the film has been picked up by West Midlands Police and will be used as part of their knife-crime education in schools.

Shelfield now also have a dedicated space for all things Speak Up. A Speak Up mural was designed by the group and was bought to life by Wolverhampton Graffiti Artist, Jack Sankson.




