UNEXPECTED TWIST is the re-telling of the Charles Dickens classic, *Oliver Twist*, by one the bestloved figures in the children's book world, **Michael Rosen**. Combining two stories in one; Rosen's story and the Dickens classic that inspired it. Two stories that twist together, unexpectedly!

Shona and her class are studying the book, *Oliver Twist*. She's the new girl in school and is finding it hard to stay out of trouble – much like Oliver himself! When she's given a new phone by a stranger, she begins to suspect there's something unusual about the new boys she's met.

Micheal Rosen is the English children's novelist, poet, and the author of 140 books. He served as Children's Laureate from June 2007 to June 2009. He has been a TV presenter and a political columnist, and his books include *Carrying the Elephant: A Memoir of Love and Loss* and *Uncle Billy Being Silly.*

This thrilling production is brought to vivid life by **The Children's Theatre Partnership**, whose shows have included *Animal Farm, Holes* and *The Jungle Book*. Directed by James Dacre (2020 Olivier Award nominated *Our Lady of Kibeho*), Rosen's novel is adapted for the stage by BAFTA award winning playwright Roy Williams with original music by rising R&B star Yaya Bey and BAC Beatbox Academy's Conrad Murray.

OLVER MANSING TO A NEW BEAT

The stage adaptation of Michael Rosen's Unexpected Twist introduces hip-hop, grime and beatboxing to the modern take on the Charles Dickens classic, Oliver Twist. Rosen, as well as Yaya Bey and Conrad Murray, who wrote the music for the show, explain how the modernisation of the story works well for young audiences.

How does it feel having your story transformed into a play with music? Rosen: It's a complete and utter thrill that

this is happening and it's very exciting. What was the original inspiration for

your book?

Rosen: I was talking to the publishers about the idea that Charles Dickens' stories often have a fantastic appeal on film, but they're sometimes quite hard for kids to lift off the page. I was thinking, 'is there some way of doing a kind of halfway house, like a modernisation in book form, so that kids doing Oliver Twist at school could have the chance to get a handle on the Dickens story via a modern analogy?. 'It felt timely in a number of ways, including the exploitation of young people. I think I pulled punches to a certain extent in terms of the types of exploitations that go on - county lines and that sort of thing. Things like that that are happening all over the country, are very Dickensian and very close to his original storu

What lead to your involvement in Unexpected Twist?

Murray: James [Dacre, the director] called me because he'd heard of the work I'd done on *Crongton Knights* with Pilot, which was a young adult book that we turned into a show with music featuring hip-hop, beatbox, grime and spoken word. He told me about this project, and I thought it sounded really exciting.

Both the book and the play perfectly capture the way young people speak. Was that important to you?

Rosen: Absolutely. [Laughs] I was trying to capture that, but I didn't manage it nearly as well as the playwright, Roy Williams, has done. It's brilliant and all the better for it.

How would you describe the styles of music in the show?

Murray: You'd call it beatbox but we're

recreating genres, so it's drill, R&B, hip-hop, pop and soul. That's the mash-up and it's quite modern.

What do you see as the importance of plays with music like this one for young audiences?

Bey: Music always helps to put a story across. Music is inviting and it makes things more approachable for people, especially in a play like this which is aimed at youth. Including music in the show makes it more relatable and it hooks that young audience in.

Conrad: Young people will recognise the characters and the slang, and while a lot of older plays have a middle-class worldview this is very representative - with black, white and Asian characters on stage that kids will relate to. It's very mixed, with cultural references that will really resonate wherever you are in the country.

Will young people see themselves reflected on stage in *Unexpected Twist*?

Rosen: Definitely. It's that thing of even if you yourself are not that person on stage and don't identify with them directly, you may feel there's somebody down the road who is like them. And for adults in the audience, they'll certainly learn from seeing how the kids engage with each other in the classroom and the way the teacher, Miss Cavani, is juggling all the characters and doing a wonderful job of negotiating her way through the curriculum as the kids spark off each other.

What's the importance of *Unexpected Twist* for young people?

Murray: I feel like we can push young audiences, which is what the play does. They are exposed to so much stuff now through TikTok and Instagram so you can take them a bit further. It can still be beautiful, and it can still be escapism, but we shouldn't patronise young audiences. This kind of theatre is in many ways the hardest to make because they're a tough audience and they see through things. That's why Roy Williams' script is so good, because his street language feels real and always up-to-date.

Bey: Oliver Twist has always existed but now there's Unexpected Twist as a new, contemporary way to examine the subject.

REVEL HORWOOD

talks to us about returning to the role of Miss Hannigan in Annie

hat made you want to return to ANNIE, and what is so appealing about the role of Miss Hannigan?

just love this character so much; am deeply in love with her. I think she is absolutely fantastic and an extremely misunderstood woman. Playing her is like an actor's playground, she is a tyrant and a villain, and those are always the most fun characters to play. I couldn't believe that they wanted me to play Miss Hannigan at first, but I thought it would be great, and a real challenge for me. I play her for real – she's not a pantomime dame, there's no mucking about or breaking the fourth wall, she's a very real character in a beautifully written show Are there any

particular challenges to playing Miss Hannigan?

Well, the challenges are that you need to be honest and real with it. Obviously, body language has a lot to do with that, how she speaks, and the accent of course – which I spent months perfecting. As **ANNIE** is set in 1930s New York, it's really nice to play a part who speaks differently than almost anyone does these days.

Audiences probably know you best as a judge on *Strictly Come Dancing*, do you enjoy performing and dancing on the stage as opposed to judging others?

Well, I grew up on musicals. I did West Side Story in Australia and then went into Me and My Girl and La Cage Aux Folles. I joined the famous Lido de Paris and the Moulin Rouge and then that led into being part of West End shows. The last musical I appeared in in the West End was Crazy For You which opened in 1993. I had a really fun year that year. I then left to become a director and choreographer, and subsequently a judge on Strictly. My first hoorah back onto the boards was when I was asked to do panto over ten years ago, and that reignited my passion for performing again really. When I was then asked to do Annie a few years ago I couldn't believe it, and I've not looked back since!

It's long been said never work with children or animals, but in ANNIE you do both! Are there any challenges that come with this or do they bring something extra to the show? We have several sets of children on **ANNIE**, so they bring something really organic to the show. You'll never get the same show twice. You have to play it differently with each set of children and they are so talented and doing incredible work on the stage and are all fantastic young actors. They will come up with stuff and you've got to react to it live on stage which is a bit of a challenge!

What was your first experience of musical theatre?

The first show that I ever went to see was Jesus Christ Superstar in Sydney back in the 1970s. I just fell in love with theatre right there and then. I started training when I was 14, and when I saw Cats in London around the same time, I knew that was absolutely what I wanted to do, to train for and study for.

You're busy all year with *Strictly,* performing and often choreographing and directing shows as well. What do you like to do during any down time you get?

I like sleeping in my own bed and cooking in my own home. There's nothing better to pass the time – whether to test and make up some new recipes or really get stuck into cooking something. I love it, I could cook for days on end.

Have you ever been given a piece of advice, or some words of wisdom that have stuck with you?

My teacher used to say, "you need to be like a tiger and fearless", which is of course very apt for this industry. You must be prepared to fail, and as soon as you get used to that you start learning. Personally, I feel that listening to your inner voice is the most important thing, especially when making decisions in this industry. I don't often rule with my head; I rule with my heart. Finally, what can audiences expect when

Finally, what can audiences expect when they come to see you as Miss Hannigan in ANNIE?

Number one – entertainment, number two – a shock! Number three – some great singing, dancing and acting because we've got such a brilliantly talented cast, and of course all of the incredible songs that they know and love.

THE GREATEST CROSSOVER OF ALL TIME?

What happens when Britain's greatest playwright and choreographer combine?

Sir Matthew Bourne OBE is widely hailed as the UK's most popular and successful choreographer and director. His company, New Adventures has become the most successful and busiest dance company in the UK and is a major exporter of British dance across the world. Now, for the first time, Wolverhampton is about to experience the magic of Matthew Bourne, who sat down with Scott Bird to talk about bringing one of his latest works, ROMEO AND JULIET to the Grand Theatre.

"It's very exciting that we're coming to a new theatre. It hasn't happened for quite a while, that we've performed somewhere new, so we're very much looking forward to Wolverhampton. We go to a lot of venues throughout the year and it's lovely to see an audience grow and grow when we return. We've got that trust around the country and it's been a while since we started a fresh journey with a theatre we haven't played before so it's exciting to get going in Wolverhampton."

Matthew Bourne's productions are often thought of as the perfect introduction to dance - not just a ballet nor a musical but the most unique hybrid of both. "I'd call it 'Dance Theatre', our work is closer to Musical Theatre in its scale and accessibility but it's storytelling without words. It's always spectacular to look at, we have a company of wonderful actor-dancers who are brilliant at conveying a story. Our work is always story and character lead, it's very helpful to an audience who aren't used to watching a dance narrative. When I make a piece, I always imagine I am a person in the audience who knows nothing about the story or where it came from and it's my job to take the audience on a spectacular journey. I take my job very seriously and it has resulted in the most wonderful trust from our audiences who may not necessarily book to see any other version of the story we're presenting."

Famous for his unique take on existing stories, it's all part of the adventure discovering a fresh perspective on well known characters and their journeys. "I think when we first started out there was a nervousness that it wasn't really Swan Lake or The Nutcracker but usually now my audiences are booking because they want to know what's unique about it. The creation of a new show is very much the part of the process I really enjoy - many of the shows I've done are very familiar stories and I take a look at them and ask a lot of questions, the what ifs... what if I change the period in which it's set, what if we change the sex of that character what would it do to the story? Audiences always have something they can hang on to in these pieces because they already know the story quite well but then I play with that and it's always a lot of fun for all involved!"

Audiences at ROMEO AND JULIET will still experience Shakespeare's original love story and despite it's timeless themes, it will speak to modern audiences in all new ways. "It's very much a Romeo and Juliet type of story, we do have all of the main characters and it builds towards the devastating conclusion but in quite a different way. It's set in an institution, it's mysterious as to why they're all there – it could be a prison, it could be a borstal, a school or a social experiment that the government are having... it feels like the young people have been dumped there but for what reason we don't know. Perhaps they're there for breaking the rules of society, for daring to show individuality but it's all part of the experience for the audience to decide for themselves."

on making magic and mayhem for Wolverhampton

Works a rich history of pantomime dating back to its opening year, 1894. Throughout all that time, the well-respected artform and firm family favourite is an integral piece of the season every year. Recently, the Grand Theatre has taken steps towards producing the pantomime in house and this year's production of **SNOW WHITE** is the first to begin with a completely blank page. Scott Bird sat down with returning pantomime favourites **Tam Ryan** and **Ian Adams** to discuss how their input this year begins right now...

For every theatre that stages a pantomime at Christmas, there is an audience expectation, a friendly familiarity but the excitement of the unexpected... "that's always the challenge" says Tam. "What we have to do is celebrate nostalgia and tradition but move pantomime forward. The Grand Theatre is very good at keeping panto relevant. When it's not reinvented and you rely too heavily on what worked before, it does the artform a disservice - that can be where the idea that panto is old fashioned comes from. The age-old comedy tricks will stand the test of time but the presentation of them and the writing of pantomime must evolve. Excitingly for us this year, we've been given the pen..."

"This will be the fourteenth pantomime I've written" adds Ian. "Collaborating with Tam is very exciting for me. There are things that individually we both know so much more intensely than the other and can add to the mix, bringing together what we've written to make the perfect recipe".

Tam: "I was up until 2 o'clock writing the other morning... we needed a starting point..."

lan: "You'd written half the show love..."

Tam: "But that's it, you see, it's easy to get carried away and lan's experience of writing pantos compliments the gap in my knowledge. There will be a really strong story arc with comedy all the way through. We're such a good team, we allow each other breathing space and ultimately, we both allow the show to be king..."

Ian: "The show is always king. The production itself is the star and as a company we do all we can to contribute to its sparkle."

For pantomime to be at its best, it has to be unique to the town it plays and if possible, unique to the theatre it is in. The 'look' of a pantomime is just as *'I honestly don't think there's a better theatre for pantomime, or any other genre for that matter'*

important as the content and therefore this year's Grand Theatre pantomime will feature a brand-new set, currently being designed and built as well as a whole new collection of costumes.

"There's a great deal of compromise that comes when you have to use someone else's ideas, set, costumes and script" Tam explains. "For this year's show, we've got a blank canvas and that's hugely exciting for us and for the people of Wolverhampton – if you're reading this now, this show is made for you and I can promise that it is going to be big, it's going to be spectacular and very seasonal... it's *Snow* White... the clue is in the title - it's going to be very Christmassy!"

Pantomime is a celebration of the town, its people, and the local cultures. The opportunity to really focus on Wolverhampton therefore, and to celebrate the Wulfrunian people and places is something both Tam and Ian are keen to bring to the forefront. The town of Wulfrunia, where our story is set this year, will feel very familiar as will some of the locations within the story.

Ian tells us "This is the first time in a very, very, long time that the Grand Theatre will have created a pantomime from scratch, without borrowing or using something that's been used in another theatre before. It's very important that we do something people will not be able to see somewhere else. There are some very magical elements that haven't really been seen in pantomime before and particularly in a theatre such as the Grand, they will look pretty spectacular!"

Wolverhampton Grand Theatre is built for pantomime. The intimate three-tiered auditorium is shaped in such a way that even the furthest seats feel close to the action. Pantomime performers throughout the years have always commented on how special and unique it is to play the Grand. Jimmy Tarbuck, who is synonymous with audiences at the London Palladium made a guest appearance in the 2019 production of Dick Whittington and said at the time; "It's a pleasure to be in such a nice theatre as Wolverhampton Grand which I totally regard as a 'Baby Palladium' it's the same shape. I've always said that the London Palladium is the best theatre in the world and Wolverhampton Grand is as close as you'll get."

Tam agrees, "This theatre is great for any comedian. I'm not saying this just to be sycophantic, that's a good word isn't it, but I honestly don't think there's a better theatre for pantomime or any other genre for that matter... the way the Dress and Grand circles wrap around the stage and the intimacy it creates is magic. As performers, we thrive on the audience reaction and the better the reaction the better the show, atmosphere and momentum builds. It's a triumph of architecture to get 1,200 people in a building and for it still to feel so intimate, to feel like you're having a conversation with a person at the back of the Grand Circle ... it's great! I can't wait to put what we're planning on stage. This is a pantomime for the Grand Theatre, for the people of Wolverhampton – and the surrounding areas - and it's going to be truly special. As we speak, 15,000 tickets have already been sold so I'd be quick if I were you... it's never too early to think about panto, as I guess we've just proved. We can't wait to see you there!"

vie Pickerill made her pantomime debut in our critically acclaimed production of *Cinderella* in 2021, a firm favourite with families, she's back home and centre stage again this Christmas, taking on the role of Snow White and reunited with Tam Ryan and Ian Adams, she's delighted to be home!

"It's so nice to be back! I was driving to the theatre for my photoshoot and I could have cried! It sounds so dramatic but it's just so nice to be home for Christmas and to be back in the show with **Tam** and **Ian!** I can't wait! I don't want to wish the year away but I'm already so excited for Christmas! I have the best memories from *Cinderella*. It was my first pantomime and I had the most magical time and I had someone that I knew in the audience for pretty much every show, an old teacher or school friend, it was just so lovely! I performed here when I was 16 and I remember thinking I need to come back here and perform professionally if I can and to say that I am for a second time is just mind blowing. I sat down, looked at myself in the mirror and cried, that I'd made it here... so many generations of my family have been in this theatre and to do it once was wonderful and now, I get a second bite of the apple..."

Despite her busy schedule, Evie found the time to come and watch last year's production of *Aladdin*...

"I just can't keep away! It's such a beautiful theatre, both to play and to look at, we're so lucky that it's still here and doing so well. I came to watch *Aladdin* last year and to be sat in the audience watching one of the Grand pantos, after so many years of seeing them as a child was so magical. The Grand pantos are incredible and now going into **SNOW WHITE** after seeing *Aladdin* makes me even more excited because I know what the audience will experience! Everyone behind the scenes and front of house make it so wonderful, it's a really lovely environment to be in."

As a *CBeebies* presenter, Evie is a household name to families up and down the country. Her presenting job is so important to her and panto is an opportunity to extend the relationship with the young viewers. "Panto is usually a child's first experience of

ACCESS A WORLD OF

Here at Wolverhampton Grand, we believe that everyone should be able to enjoy the **magic of live theatre.** To make this possible we regularly schedule a range of accessible performances throughout our programme including BSL Interpreted, Captioned, Audio Described and Relaxed.

We had the pleasure of chatting to West End Theatre Interpreter, Donna Ruane from Theatresign. Donna has a passion for performing arts and has been a lead and co-tutor at Theatresign for over 10 years.

Q: Can you tell us what a British Sign Language Interpreted performance looks like and how it can benefit customers?

A: A BSL Interpreted performance looks exactly the same as a general performance but with the addition of a BSL interpreter who will interpret the whole show into Sign Language for Deaf, BSL using patrons. On occasion the interpreter may be incorporated into the performance and move with some of the action. We are usually dressed in keeping with the show for the comfort and enjoyment of the whole audience as it can aid those who do not need the service in being able to 'forget' our presence.

Q: How long have you been a BSL interpreter?

A: I qualified in 2000 and since then I have also qualified as an Assessor and independent verifier of the NVQ qualifications to become a BSL interpreter.

Q: What's the best part about your job?

A: The people! I feel so fortunate to be able to meet so many Deaf community members and their families around the UK and often stop for a chat after the show. I see many returning faces and so every location I go to feels just a little bit like home. The shows are a joy to work on and over the years I have learned so much from the Actors/Directors/Choreographers and technical crews that it has made me a better Interpreter in this field, and a more empathetic professional to the roles that contribute to making theatre come alive for patrons.

Q: What's your favourite show to

work on and why? A: This is always a hard one as I am working on so many. I think that each show has its own challenges, whether that's in the lyrics, the language, the emotion or the pace – the joy comes from the faces I see, the tears, the laughter and the magic that patrons feel. It's a true ho

magic that patrons feel. It's a true honour to work in a domain where I can be reflective, expressive, creative and instantly see the impact on the audience.

Q: Do you have any advice for customers who may never have experienced a BSL interpreted performance before?

A: Come with an open mind. Choose seats that give you a good sightline to the

stage and the interpreter (many venues have these seats blocked out so that they are available to Deaf patrons). And most importantly, RELAX! We are here so that you can sit back and be entertained. We will reflect the actors and show their emotion and give you time to be able to see the action without losing the story.

Q: If you were to describe yourself as a character from a musical, who would it be & why?

A: This one has made me chuckle... I think Fiona from *Shrek*, she is funny, sassy, gentle, kind,

beautiful and ugly. Being an interpreter means that I get to bring the beauty and the ugliness of each character and each story to life, I have no time to be concerned about my looks or be embarrassed about the faces I pull – it's all about giving access, that's my priority.

or our most recent Community Panto Project, a combination of thirty community groups and schools, including Compton Care, African Caribbean Community Initiative, Breast Cancer Action Group Wolverhampton, Confederation of Bangladeshi Organisations, LGBTQ+ Fusion and St. Andrews CE Primary School, have worked on the Make A Wish project, based on the story of *Aladdin.*

Part of what makes Wolverhampton Grand Theatre's pantomime season so special is the bringing together of communities, families, and friends that it encourages. This is evident during the performances but extends beyond that in the form of the annual Community Panto Project. This historic initiative has added an extra touch of magic to panto each year by allowing local groups to combine their creative efforts and produce an exhibition for display during the run.

The final creation, Aladdin's Grand Antique Shop, was enjoyed by thousands of visitors to the Grand Theatre during the Pantomime season of 22/23, who were able to take in the fabulous display which was situated in our stalls foyer. From antique fans to patchwork cushions, and all kinds of other trinkets and treasures, the intricate details of the larger exhibit are a beautiful display of creativity within the local community. Around 400 pieces of work are featured overall, the earliest of which were crafted in September 2022 during a two-hour textile workshop led by Pauline Fletcher from Heath House Studios, with whom the project is in collaboration with.

The designing, stitching, and assembling continued over the weeks, allowing for the impressive final piece, but also for moments of real connection amongst groups.

The Grand Theatre's Outreach

Manager for Creative Learning, James Collins, explains "One of the things that I love most about this project is seeing the moments of joy that it brings about. During the sessions you get to see a huge variety of ideas brought to life by all kinds of fantastic people, and the excitement that process brings is something I never grow tired of. To then see their work combined in one exhibition, and for the excitement to extend to the audiences who then get to see it, is just the kind of magic that we do this for."

Refugee and Migrant Centre ESOL teacher Victoria Nimmo agrees "The workshops gave the ESOL learners a chance to relax and be themselves. For those few hours they were able to switch off from the daily grind of life and be creative. They were truly surprised at what they made."

We were delighted to welcome participants of the project to watch our production of *Aladdin*, some of which had never been to a theatre before.
