pen of Black Country playwright,


David Tristram. The production will

**NEW PANTOMIME!** 



The magic of pantomime has been at the heart of Wolverhampton Grand Theatre throughout its entire 128 year history. Only two weeks after opening in 1894 a pantomime production of *Sinbad* The Sailor opened on Christmas Eve. It wasn't until 1947 that *Aladdin* was first staged as a pantomime here, but the firm audience favourite is now being staged for a thirteenth time, with an exciting new production currently being created! Scott Bird chatted to this year's stars **Zoe** Birkett and Michael Greco to find out more about the show!

Pantomime is perfect for the entire family, every generation coming together and for our stars, their earliest memories of panto begin very young too!

Michael Greco: "My earliest memory of theatre in Darlington, I'd be in it!"

pantomime was going to my local theatre and I really couldn't make out if the Dame was actually a woman! I was so naive and young that I wasn't aware that the Pantomime Dame was always played by a man. I remember thinking that lady had a very deep voice!"

**Zoe Birkett:** "My Mom and Dad used to take me to the panto as little kid. We used to go to the Theatre Royal in Newcastle on a coach and the first one I saw was Peter Pan – I remember Tinkerbell flying across the theatre and it was so magical! It was one of the things that made me fall in love with theatre – before I knew it, I was one of the little kids in Joseph sitting next to the narrator and any time a show that required kids came along to our local

making the magic this year...

MG: I think the special thing about panto is the Great British sense of humour that sets it apart from all other theatre productions. From the Panto Dame to the Evil Wizard, we all love to be drawn into their world and equally be a part of their life when they break the fourth wall. No other country in the world has the uniqueness that panto brings... the fact that it's in and around Christmas time where spirits are high make it even more magical! Tradition is upheld for at least a few weeks and I think each and every one of the audience from young to old will come away from **ALADDIN** feeling exceedingly satisfied."

**ZB:** "I love pantomime because it ticks all the boxes for everything a family needs in a visit to the theatre. Everyone can come together and enjoy it from the grandparents through to the kids. Often families won't have seen each other for ages but the panto is a great excuse to come together. A friend of mine always brings her family to the panto I'm doing and it's her gift to them – every Boxing Day they know they're going to come together and see a panto and uphold a tradition and that's lovely!"

It has been said time and time again that the Grand Theatre is perfect for pantomime because of its intimate design – everyone feels close to the magic and our cast are excited to get on stage to make it happen!

**ZB:** "I'm so excited to do panto here in Wolverhampton. I've done panto for years and I've played the Grand in musicals twice, but I've never done panto the stage and immediately fell in here. I know what a gorgeous theatre it is and the people here have always been so lovely. The staff are great and so welcoming and that's really important when you're here for a long time – we're going to have so much fun! I had a great experience here in

theatre to have on a tour, when you see Wolverhampton on the tour list it's a good feeling because you know you're going to have a good week and be looked after! Especially being Northern myself, it's nice to be up north... I know it's the Midlands but anything north of London feels like home enough for me!"

MG: "This is my first time performing at the Grand and I am beyond excited to appear on stage here. On the day of our poster photoshoot, I walked onto love. Wolverhampton Grand is such a beautiful theatre that obviously has a tremendous history. I think every seat in the auditorium is as good as

MG: "Being a recent dad, it will be extra special for me to have my young boy in the audience. Although

I'm not sure he will be old enough to recognise daddy as the evil Abanazar, let's wait and see! I've played Abanazar before and it's a hugely demanding role as the emphasis is greatly focused on saving your voice. Trying to be heard over the top of the boos can give a lot of strain to your voice and with 65 shows to do, knowing how to control your voice is essential. I'm sure the children will love and hate me, let's face it. The more scared they are then that means I've done my job! I will try and make him the greatest Panto Villain that Wolverhampton has ever seen!"

**ZB:** "We're huge Christmas fans in our house! For me, it's always about getting the family together and eating good food! Christmas as I've gotten older has changed now I'm a mother

but that makes it even more magical experiencing it with my daughter, prepping for Santa to come! We're going to have Christmas in Wolverhampton this year, all the family are going to be here and we're going to make it very special. My daughter's going to come to the panto a lot too! I did Wicked Queen when she was very young but we've had lockdown since then and last Christmas I was doing *Moulin Rouge* in the West End so for her this will be the first proper panto that she understands and I know it will bring a lot of magical memories for her, as it will the children who come to see it!"

## KEVIN CLIFTON & MAISIE SMITH

hen Kevin Clifton was ten years old, he watched STRICTLY BALLROOM and, as a budding competitive dancer, immediately saw himself in the character of Scott Hastings, recalling: "He was a hero to me and such an inspiration."

Kevin was being taught ballroom and Latin by his parents and told the four times British Latin American Champions: "I guarantee you that one day they're going to make a musical out of this and I'm going to play Scott Hastings."

Three decades later Clifton's dream has come true. "It combines all my favourite things: Singing, dancing, acting, sequins and a bit of glitz and glamour," says the former *EastEnders* actress and *Strictly Come Dancing* finalist who is making her musical theatre debut.

"It's such an amazing role to play in my first ever musical. It's such a feelgood show, and of course it's got such great dancing and music in it - Latin flavours, modern tracks and some real classics."

The central message of 'A life lived in fear is a life half-lived' chimes with Clifton. "I left my comfort zone of *Strictly Come Dancing* to do more theatre, and that's the message of *Strictly Ballroom* doing what you love and going after the life you want to live."

Smith is happy to be reunited with her Children in Need dancing partner three years after they bagged the Glitterball trophy. "We got on so well and that was the start of my Strictly journey," she says, having gone on to compete on Strictly itself the following year when she eventually came second.

Clifton concurs. "We worked really well together, it's great to be reunited.

I can't wait for people to see what Maisie can do. We've seen her dancing and acting but she's also a really good singer."

"As for the show itself, it's as good as musical theatre gets, with great singing, great dancing and a love story at its heart."



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



Ahead of its arrival here in

London's West End, Deborah sat down
to tell us how the story has been
adapted for a brand new stage show.

"I've adapted the story from the novel and it's quite a different creature to both the book and the film. There are the same characters, the same dilapidated hotel and all of that, but it's a very different experience on stage. The stagecraft is something I've had to work on, thinking 'How do we keep everything in one place?' They've built this amazing set for the hotel and downstage will be the street and call centre. And there's a lovely sound system featuring the sounds of India strumming in the background, with cars hooting in the distance and people selling their wares, and that will come to the fore sometimes."

Adapting the novel for the stage has been a whole new adventure for Deborah, a key theme of the story itself...

"It's never too late to have another adventure. 70 is the new 50 and we're not behaving in the way people used to behave when they were so-called 'old'. There's been a sea change in how we view older people in that you're not old, you're the same person you always were. You have the same loves, disappointments, resentments and joy as you ever

had, you're just a bit more wrinkly.

Parcelling them off as old people, which is what I used to do when I was young, is not the case once you get old yourself. You're exactly the same. I wanted to write something about people who are just like everyone else, they're just a bit older.

The world has changed so much. A lot of us would be dead by now but miracles of modern medicine mean here we still are. I'm living in Kent and swimming every day in the sea with my grandchildren.

That's not what people are 'supposed' to do at this age."

Deborah's work has inspired many more stories about the older generation and has inspired a much more fun, adventurous outlook...

"Since the first Marigold Hotel film I think there are many more stories. They're about people who happen to be older but whose stories and adventures need not be about being towards the end of your life. The book changed things a bit and the film changed things hugely, by altering our perception of old age. There's much more coming out, although there's still not enough. There are many more examples of older people having interesting things happen to them rather than them being in the waiting room or departure lounge."

The play will inspire audiences too:
"I hope audiences will have a lot of fun
and identify things in the play that they're
experiencing or have experienced
themselves, then go away happier and
uplifted. Hopefully they'll be full of vim
about maybe having another adventure.
I'm longing to get young audiences in as
well as the older and of course a very

diverse audience too. With a lot of the Indian characters I've given them bigger stories and one of the themes of the play is the meeting of East and West, the dissipating of prejudice and showing what we have in common along with the contrast between our cultures. To get young people and a diverse audience in would be absolutely great. I hope they'll have their sympathies enlarged, not just about what they might consider old people who are past it but also about other cultures. It's about ageing and mortality but it's also about fun and how we can get on with each other. There are quite a lot of messages hidden in there."







The secret life of a comedy writer...

An interview with:

DAVID 

OF OF COMEDY

■HE SECRET LIVES OF HENRY & ALICE is a touching, highly inventive and bittersweet black comedy by local author, David Tristram.

It's often a secret life, being a writer. For example, most people probably wouldn't realise that David Tristram was actually the man behind the creation of the hugely popular Black Country comedy character Doreen Tipton (note, the same initials - no coincidence).

Working anonymously in the background, David devised, wrote and produced Doreen's stage shows, songs, books and viral videos.

Doreen quickly became a comedy legend in the Black Country and went on to be voted 'Best Midlands Entertainment Personality' by What's On readers. She also appeared in The Grand Theatre's prestigious pantomimes, winning 'Best Newcomer' at the Great British Panto Awards.

But there's much more to David Tristram than his infamous Doreen creation. Over a long career, he's also established himself as one of the UK's most popular playwrights. In fact, his comedies have now been performed more than 10,000 times by professional and amateur companies all over the world. To put that in context, it means that for the past 30 years or so, on average, someone somewhere in the world has been >

performing a David Tristram play every single night.

"It's an interesting milestone," quipped David, "which can only be achieved if you're either quite successful, or, as in my case, very old."

#### A BLACK COUNTRY LAD

Despite the success, David remains a proud Black Country man through and through. He was born in Quarry Bank, educated at Dudley Grammar School and Birmingham University, and now lives in Wolverhampton – so he's never strayed far from his roots.

#### How does it feel to see your work performed at The Grand?

"Seeing Henry and Alice open at my local theatre is a dream come true. And that's especially apt, because dreams coming true is one of the central themes of the play. The Grand is also actually a fantastic venue for comedy, because despite its scale and splendour it still remains a very intimate space, so you're able to properly connect with the actors."

In 2016, David Tristram was nominated by his peers as one of the Black Country's prestigious '100 Masters' - an award-winning initiative honouring those considered to be at the very top of their craft.

#### What is it about Black Country humour that inspires your writing?

"The Black Country is one of the least pretentious places you could ever wish to live, and it has a wonderful, robust sense of self-deprecating humour that harks back to the days when life for working folk around here was extremely tough indeed. People often turn to humour to alleviate the stress of everyday life."

# You published the play in 2001, yet it still feels completely relatable to today's audiences. Why do you think that is?

I think it's because the themes explored in the play are so universal.

One of the amazing things about the audience reactions is the way that people seem to recognise themselves so vividly in the characters of Henry and Alice, and relate so strongly to their habits, annoyances, yearnings, foibles, hopes and dreams. People I've never met before have actually come up to me and said: 'You wrote that about us — didn't you?'

This is a bittersweet comedy with a surreal twist, as Henry & Alice attempt to privately fantasize their way out of their domestic boredom. The play's fantasy sequences are further enhanced by clever use of stage projection, helping

to transport us in a blink of an eye from a living room to the beach, from the pub to the TV studio, from the American Super Bowl to the police station, from the office to the Oscars, the hospital to the fairground. So apart from the verbal fireworks, there's also a visual surprise ground every corner.


For most of the action, the audiences tend to know what's going on far more than the characters themselves do – but will they see the extraordinary twist that's coming at the end?"

#### What will audiences take away from The Secret Lives of Henry and Alice?

"The Secret Lives of Henry & Alice is, in the end, a reflection of all our lives. Funny, sad, precious, sometimes chaotic, far from perfect - but ultimately hopeful. I hope audiences will come away laughing, asking questions, rewinding sections of the action in their minds, and ultimately – most importantly – communicating with each other. Because above all else, this is a play about connecting.

As Bob Dylan once said: You can be in my dream, if I can be in yours."

# JACK RYDE

We talk to Jack Ryder ahead of his return to the Grand to direct our in-house production of **The Secret Lives Of Henry & Alice.** 

nown to many for his TV roles such as Jamie Mitchell in EastEnders and Evan Crowhurst in Holby City, Jack Ryder also has an impressive theatre career both on stage and off. His directing credits include the Take That musical The Band, Calendar Girls, The Full Monty and more recently, the Wolverhampton Grand Theatre production of Alan Bennett's The History Boys in February 2020. Now, Jack is back to direct our new production, THE SECRET LIVES OF HENRY & ALICE and he sat down with Scott Bird to talk about our latest project.

"When I first started directing, I was working with two magnificent producers in London and one of my jobs was to sit and read through the scripts that were submitted to us. I read a lot of material in that time, much of it was great, but you always notice and remember the plays that make you laugh out loud. When I read THE SECRET LIVES OF HENRY & ALICE by David Tristram recently, I got the same feeling. When you begin laughing out loud, there's obviously something in that writing and there were many moments where I was sat at home doing exactly that... I'm not a big laugher, I tend to chuckle in my head, but I couldn't help laughing and that told me that this is something I need to work on."

The play is from the pen of the Black Country's own David Tristram, whose comedy writing is known for its observational and very witty take on life. Everyone has encountered one of David Tristram's characters within someone they know, whether it's a family member, the

person next door or at the hairdressers.. David's creation Doreen Tipton is the perfect example, as are the characters Henry and Alice.

"David told me how this play is an accumulation of humorous stories, situations and anecdotes from friends and people he'd met over the years that have now shaped the lives of this married couple. So many people will relate to having a partner who, after many years together, have settled into a groove where they wind the other person up slightly with their habits and rituals and I can imagine they will sit there watching this play, knocking each other and saying 'you do that!' — it's all taken very light heartedly and humorously but there's a lot of truth in it, particularly in people's ways... you'll

see someone you know in Henry or Alice."

Casting the parts will require Jack to
find actors with the most versatile of skills.

"It's two actors on stage playing multiple roles... Henry and Alice take on the personas of many different parts as they drift off into dream worlds in their heads. I read it and thought this is a tough call, you need magicians to play these parts... The accents, the physical comedy elements, the more tender moments. It has it all and the casting is the final bit of the jigsaw and when you get it right, it's a masterpiece."

On returning to Wolverhampton, Jack realises the importance of local theatres producing their own work.

"I think it's superb that the Grand are producing. This theatre provides an environment to create, encourage and develop talent and puts it in front of a

home crowd. I'm delighted to be back after such a great time directing *The* History Boys. I quickly learned that it's a very well-run theatre, the staff are lovely and we've kept in touch over the lockdown and remained friends - there's a good vibe and it all felt very healthy and enjoyable. It was a wonderful atmosphere so the opportunity to come back to Wolverhampton and direct anything with the team there is a privilege. People often ask me what I prefer, TV or theatre, and I always say it's about the people. It's not about the job, it's about the place and Wolverhampton Grand has a great creative vibe, a determined drive and it's a great environment to make theatre in. This production will blend every theatrical element, including projection and sound, utilising all of the skill within the Grand Theatre team. We all saw the magic that happened with *The History Boys*, it was a wonderful feeling and I couldn't be happier to be back working at the Grand Theatre and continuing that creative journey here."

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Here at Wolverhampton Grand, we believe that everyone should be able to enjoy the magic of live theatre. To make this possible, we regularly schedule a range of accessible performances throughout our programme including Audio Description, BSL Interpreted, Captioned and Relaxed.

We had the pleasure of chatting to UK audio description pioneer, Anne Hornsby from Mind's Eye. Anne provides most of the Grand's audio description, and we couldn't wait to hear what she had to say...

#### Q: Can you give us a brief description of what audio description is and how it can benefit customers?

A: Audio description makes sure no-one misses out. It gives blind and partially sighted customers information about the visual aspects of a show or a play. This can include details about, for example - the appearance of characters and their costumes; about the design for a show – the sets and the lighting; and about movement and visual jokes and comedy. Description enables blind and visually impaired people to feel included and part of the theatre experience.

The audio description experience begins with a touch tour of the set and costumes, where we take people onstage for a close up discovery tour; the customers are then given a discreet headset, and can hear an introduction lasting ten to fifteen minutes, with details about the set, the costumes and the characters; and then they hear the description, which is woven around the dialogue and songs of the show, keeping everyone up to speed with what is unfolding

#### Q: How long have you been working with **Wolverhampton Grand Theatre?**

A: Around twenty-five years and possibly even longer!

#### Q: What's the best part about being an audio describer?

A: I love knowing I have made a real difference to people's experiences and enabled them to enjoy their visit. I also relish the performative element of the job, getting the timing and the emotion of the scene just right, and I've always been a writer, so audio description seems to draw on the skills that I enjoy using.

#### Q: What's your favourite show to describe and why?

A: I tend to enjoy whatever show I am working on currently! I like Chicago because it's stylish and slick: I like Les Misérables because it's epic and you feel as if you have taken your audience on a journey with you; I like shows which have a challenge and offer real opportunities for description where it is really needed in terms of understanding the plot and the characters.

Q: We know that you love to dress up for touch tours, talk us through some

A: For Rocky Horror I usually have to find a pair of stockings, a red basque and a feather boa! or if it's a bit chilly maybe just a black dress! I also have a white satin dress and white boots which I like to wear for Mamma

Did you know: Assistance dogs are welcome in the auditorium, or we can organise a verified volunteer to take care of them when needed.

Mia!, and the boots do for Kinky Boots as well. For Chicago it's usually a Matron Mamma Morton black trouser suit!

#### Q: Finally, as we approach panto season what is your favourite Pantomime to describe?


A: I do love all pantomimes so it's hard to choose. Like a big kid, I enjoy watching the transformations, and then of course describing them so that the magic is conveyed to the listeners. Maybe Cinderella is my favourite, because that always has a great transformation scene, and Aladdin's cave of wonders usually merits some sparkly description too. One of the highlights of my year is the annual Grand pantomime where we welcome families supported by Guide Dogs for Blind People and the RNIB. Introducing those young people to pantomime and taking them on the stage for the touch tour is an absolute joy!

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
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#### **Unexpected Twist**

From page to stage, but with an unexpected twist...



ow one of Britain's most successful playwrights, Roy Williams grew up surrounded bu Charles Dickens. His West London council estate was named in honour of Henru Dickens, local Councillor and grandson of the famous author. Roy's own block was Dombey House. "I was always a sucker for Dickens." Roy says. "My mum was a huge fan, so from a very young age I loved his stories."

An avid reader, happier to have his nose in a book or to be listening to a story than working out a spreadsheet or a maths problem, Dickens' characters fuelled Roy's imagination. "Dickens was a real man of his time. He told stories about what he was seeing, and he wrote about what he was unhappy with. Oliver Twist is driven by the ill treatment of children that he witnessed."

With Oliver Twist being one of his favourites, when Rou was approached to adapt Michael Rosen's Unexpected *Twist*, he was excited by the challenge of using his imagination to give the worlds of Victorian London and Rosen's modern story a unique, theatrical life. **UNEXPECTED TWIST** centres on Shona, a young girl arriving at her new school, trying to find her way in challenging new circumstances, while managing an equally challenging family life. Alongside Shona's story, the corresponding tale of Oliver Twist unfolds. "I loved the idea of two parallel stories as a way to examine if some things have really changed. The play means we can look at that through the characters of Shona and Oliver, even though they are 200 years apart. I love the use of time and how distant moments resonate from each other."

"Adapting this book for the stage gave me license to be as imaginative as possible. It's been a challenge and I knew it would push me as a writer, but in a really exciting way. I've needed to

discover theatrical moments where both worlds collide in one. I want Dickens to be hovering around the contemporary world so that we have the sense that the world of 200 years ago is still around us."

"The show will also have a lot of music, which is a first for me. I'm excited by that and I love what I've heard from Yaya Bey and Conrad Murray. My job is to give them something to work with so they can sprinkle their own magic."

Roy is passionate about the importance of theatre for young people. "It's become a cliché that young people are the future, but clichés are there because they are true!" For Roy there were few opportunities to experience theatre, and he didn't see live performance until he was in his late teens. "As a young, black, workingclass boy, there wasn't anyone around saying, have a look at this". Watching a recording of *Macbeth*, starring Judi Dench and Ian McKellen on an old fashioned black and white TV in the school hall had a big impact.

"I was gripped. I thought, I like this!"

Above all Roy hopes he can encourage his young audience to think about themselves and the world they are living in. To remind them that when they leave school they have to take part in that world, to have an opinion and to be actively involved in what they currently see the 'grown ups' doing. "I want them to look at themselves and start questioning. So much of what Michael Rosen and Dickens were writing about has relevance now. The news of food banks, rising poverty,


the energy crisis – has been grist to the mill of my writing."

'But what we also see is how Oliver and Shona develop their own resilience. I want a young audience to recognise their own abilities from an early age. There's strength in our kids and I want them to know they have that inner power.'

We're taking you to musical theatre heaven, and it's going to be fabulous, baby!

ou're well known to many as Dorien Green from Birds of a Feather alongside your stage work, which includes an Olivier-nomination for Young Frankenstein. What are the key differences between the disciplines of stage and screen, and do you have a preference?

If you asked me why I came into the business, it would be because I love theatre. I went to drama school in the '60s, and it was a very different world then. I grew up doing theatre and started first when I was seven. Theatre was always what I was destined to do and then gradually television took over. Birds of a Feather came along in 1989 and has never been off since! I love television, I love the opportunities television brings, but if I had to choose it would be theatre because I love the connection with the audience. With television you can always do it again, whereas with theatre it's a question of doing it that night and that's your one chance.

I think theatre is where my heart is. I love the atmosphere and the family you build. I love to stand in the wings and watch other people work. I also love what theatre can do to an audience. Live theatre can change neonle's lives

#### SISTER ACT is a much-loved movie as well as a musical. Were you aware of the show before joining?

I saw Craig Revel Horwood's Sister Act revival with Alexandra Burke, so I was very aware of the show before I joined. The musical doesn't have the music from the film, but it's Alan Menken's music - who is a genius. He's been to see our show twice and loved it! I think people love the production because of the great music, and it's very much an audience show. You leave feeling so uplifted. We were playing in London to 3,000 people per night, with every show packed full of

people waving their arms in the air at the end and just having a fantastic time.

#### Can you briefly summarise the plot (without spoilers), and tell us about your character, Mother Superior?

Well, Deloris Van Cartier witnesses her boyfriend shoot someone and gets put into hiding in a convent. Mother Superior who runs the convent is a very religious person, and suddenly into her world comes this woman who is a singer, who wears short skirts, who's full of bling and very over the top. It's about how these two worlds combine and ultimately rub off on each other.

"I think theatre is where my heart is. I love the atmosphere and the family you build. I love to stand in the wings and watch other people work. I also love what theatre can do to an audience. Live theatre can change people's lives."

Mother Superior is quite strict and holu. She provides the juxtaposition of strict religious beliefs against this entirely over the top being, which is Deloris Van Cartier. You need the two extremes to rub up against one another, and quite a lot of sparks fly.

You appeared on Pilgrimage: The Road to Rome and met the Pope, what was that like and were there any elements of that experience that you've drawn on when playing Mother Superior?

Funnily enough whenever I'm in the show I do always think of this moment. I had half an hour with the Pope and I blessed him and made him laugh, and he gave me a medal to celebrate his six years in the

papacy. I've always had a spirituality about me. I love going in churches. Whenever I go into a church I will always light a candle for both of my parents and Linda Robson's mum, and say a quiet prayer. That's a spiritual thing more than an actual religious thing. I always find churches very healing in a way. It's a place to sit, contemplate and meditate, and you can come out feeling a slightly better person.


#### SISTER ACT features a fantastic score by the multi award-winning Alan Menken (Beauty and the Beast, The Little Mermaid). How would you describe the soundtrack, and do you have a favourite number to perform and/or watch?

I think the soundtrack is amazing. I must say, the audience responses so far have made me feel like we're doing a pop concert. My favourite song is one that Mother Superior has called Here Within These Walls where she describes what life is like in the convent, and how the outside world is full of sin, but inside you find God and you find yourself. It's a beautiful number, but probably the most serious number in the show to an extent. The other number I love is when Deloris first takes over the choir and she teaches them to sing and brings out their voices. It's called Raise Your Voice. The audience just go wild. Up until then you've only heard the nuns sing very badly. It stops the show!

#### What do you hope audiences take away from this new production?

I think audiences will take away a reinvigorated love for live theatre. It's a production that also says something about community, and that's one thing that the lockdown showed us was important – caring about your neighbours, caring about your friends, and helping those in need.

It's an absolutely joyous musical! To see the audiences at the end, where they stand waving their arms and singing along, they rediscover the joy of theatre.







he magic of live theatre can have a transformative effect on people's lives and wellbeing as they embark on a shared experience that enhances their individual experience. Theatre and music can prompt feelings, emotions and memories that last a lifetime. This shouldn't end because a person has dementia and here at Wolverhampton Grand we are doing all we can to keep enriching lives post-diagnosis.

We have been working towards becoming a dementia-friendly venue since joining the Wolverhampton Action Alliance back in 2016. In this time, we have held a dementia-friends session in our auditorium whilst BBC WM came to broadcast Sonny & Shay's afternoon show live from the Grand Theatre's

Encore Lounge. April 2019 saw the beginning of our monthly Memory Café's that continued virtually during the Covid-19 pandemic, reaching as far afield as Phoenix, Arizona and during the summer of 2021 we embarked on a 7 week care home tour bringing much needed live entertainment with vintage performer Miss Beth Belle.

This commitment to enhancing our dementia-friendly provision continues to develop our services and in 2022 we are reaching even more people thanks to generous sponsorship from Water Safety Specialists, Nant.

Nant have made it possible for us to offer free, 1-hour performances to those who otherwise may not be able to access the theatre by taking the magic on the road once more.





## WOLVERHAMPTON GRAND THEATRE AND NATIONAL THEATRE LAUNCH SPEAK UP SCHOOLS PROGRAMME

We hear from Lucy-Ellen Parker about what schools can expect from the speak up programme.

ollowing a successful pilot
phase that began in autumn
2021, the National Theatre's
Speak Up programme is working
with young people in five secondary
schools in Wolverhampton, Walsall,
and Telford across the next three
years. The schools are Ormiston New
Academy, Colton Hills Community
School, Tettenhall Wood School in
Wolverhampton, Ormiston Shelfield
Community Academy in Walsall, and
The Charlton School in Telford.

Speak Up is the National Theatre's new national programme which sees young people, who have been most affected by the pandemic, working in collaboration with local artists and teachers to co-create artistic responses to issues that are most important to them. Responding to the current challenges in schools, the programme aims to develop young people's self-expression, wellbeing, and personal skills, with an open-ended offer to make creative projects in their local area. It is in partnership with Wolverhampton Grand Theatre as part of the national programme which is also being delivered in Doncaster, Greater Manchester, Havering, Sunderland, and

Wakefield, with the project extending into additional areas in 2023.

The National Theatre is collaborating with LUNG as Creative Associates to deliver the training of artists and teachers and to develop the creative ambitions of Speak Up. LUNG is a campaign-led verbatim theatre company which works closely with communities nationally to shine a light on political, social, and economic issues in modern Britain to ensure hidden voices are heard.

Speak Up is generously supported by the Mohn Westlake Foundation which shares the National Theatre's belief in the power of youth voice and working with young people to enable positive change in their lives, schools, and local communities. Through a £3.3million grant to deliver the programme nationally, Speak Up will reach hundreds of thousands of students, with most of the funding distributed to partners enabling local employment of producers and artists.





Please note bag searches are in operation at all performances.


